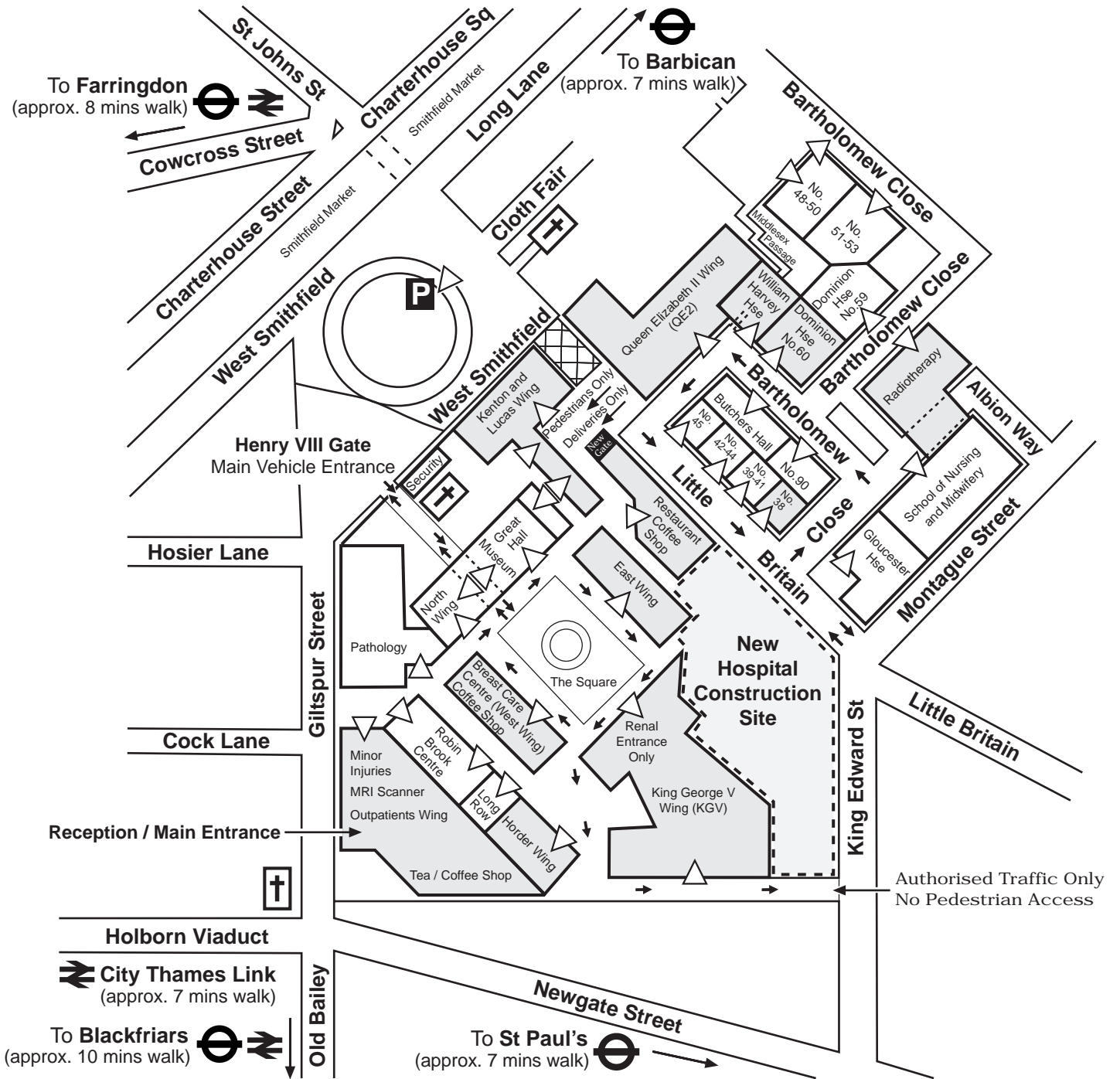

Transforming your hospital

Work is now underway to redevelop Barts as a Cancer and Cardiac Centre of Excellence, a project that will create 21st century facilities to complement our high quality clinical services.

Our priority is to ensure patient safety while this much-needed and long-overdue transformation takes place, but some disruption and noise is inevitable. We are sorry about this – please bear with us. If you are concerned about the effect of the building work on your care while you are in hospital, please tell a member of staff.

The map overleaf shows you which buildings and entrances are affected by the construction work - signs at the hospital will also help you find your way round.

Getting to Barts

If at all possible, please use public transport to come into hospital, or ask someone to drop you off:

Tube:

The nearest underground stations are Barbican, Blackfriars, Farringdon and St Paul's. Barbican and Farringdon are served by Hammersmith and City line, Metropolitan line and the Circle line. Blackfriars is served by the Circle line and District line and St Paul's is served by the Central line.

Rail:

Blackfriars, City Thameslink and Liverpool Street are the nearest National Rail stations.

Buses:

The following buses stop outside or close to the hospital: numbers 4, 8, 25, 56, 172 and 242.

Drop-off point for taxis and cars:

Patients can be dropped off in the Square – access via King Henry VIII Gate on Giltspur Street.

Pedestrian access:

For your safety, please use the main entrance on Giltspur Street.

Parking:

There is no public parking at the hospital itself, but there is metered parking in surrounding streets and an NCP car park in West Smithfield.
